Call to Order

Board President Mrs. Davis called the meeting of the Culver City Unified School District Board of Education to order at 6:00 p.m. The Board adjourned to closed session at 6:01 p.m. and reconvened the public meeting at 7:30 .m. with all Board members in attendance. Dr. Bob Knopf led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Report from Closed Session

Mrs. Davis reported that the Governing Board met in Closed Session regarding issues listed on today's Closed Session agenda and announced that no reportable actions were taken.

3. Public Hearing

3.1 Williams Textbook Sufficiency

Mrs. Davis closed the regular meeting of the Board of Education and opened the public hearing at 7:32p.m. There being no comments from the public, Mrs. Davis closed the public hearing on this matter at 7:33p.m.

3.2 Culver City Federation of Teachers (CCFT) Revised Initial Proposal for School Year 2006-2007

Mrs. Davis opened the public hearing at 7:34 p.m. Mr. Alan Elmont encouraged the district to accommodate the Union's request in their proposal, as long as the total package does not cause more than 85% of the budget to be paid out in wages, salaries and benefits. Mr. Jerry Chabola spoke regarding Coaches' salaries and encouraged the possibility of an increase in the coachs' stipends. Mrs. Davis closed the public hearing on this matter at 7:35 p.m.

3.3 Instructional Materials Funding Realignment Program (IMFRP) Certification

Mrs. Davis opened the public hearing at 7:35 p.m.

There being no comments from the public, Mrs. Davis closed the public hearing on this matter and reopened the regular meeting of the Board of Education at 7:36p.m.

Mrs. Davis called the Consent Agenda and asked if any member of the audience or the Board wished to withdraw any item. Dr. Beagles-Roos requested that items 4.1 and 4.4 be withdrawn.

4.1 Minutes of Regular Meeting - October 10, 2006 and Special Meetings of Oct. 17-19, 2006

Dr. Beagles-Roos withdrew this item because the transcribed minutes of the special meetings were not included in this item number. It was moved by Dr. Russell and seconded by Mrs. Wolkowitz that the Board approves the minutes of the October 10, 2006 regular meeting only. The motion was unanimously approved.

4.4 <u>Approval of Nominations for Two Members to the Los Angeles County Committee on School District Organization</u>

Dr. Beagles-Roos suggested and gave her reasoning as to why she thought the Board should vote for Dr. Gilbert Garcia as the Fourth Supervisorial District member and not Dr. Owen Griffith as previously recommended by Mr. Bubar. Further discussion ensued with Mrs. Wolkowitz and Mrs. Davis in agreement to vote for Dr. Garcia. By consensus it was approved to vote for Mr. Frank Ogaz and Dr. Gilbert Garcia. It was moved by Dr. Russell and seconded by Mrs. Wolkowitz that the Board approves the nominations for Membership to the Los Angeles County Committee on School District Organization. The motion was unanimously approved.

6. Public Recognition

6.1 Student Representatives' Reports

Middle School Student Representative

Chardonnay Tabor, Culver City Middle School Student Representative, reported on activities at Culver City Middle School, including an update on the Halloween Dance and Haunted House, O'Gram sales, Red Ribbon Week, and the costume contest.

Culver Park Student Representative

No representative at this time.

Culver City High School Student Representative/Student Board Member

Andy Gonzalez, Student Board Member, reported on activities at Culver City High School, including Homecoming Preparations, planning of expansion improvements to the Peace Garden and the possible addition of benches at the garden. Dr. Beagles-Roos had questions regarding the benches. Dr. Russell suggested that the Board donate a bench for the Garden. Mr. Gonzalez will get additional information as to how much the bench will cost.

6.2 Superintendent's Report

Dr. Fiello introduced Mrs. Jaffe who reported on the addition of Instructional Aides. Mrs. Jaffe also reported that she contacted West Los Angeles College

in regards to the district's need for additional Aides and they are going to post the job description at their site. Mrs. Jaffe reported on her visit to the High School and commended the staff, teachers and students on working together implementing the new school policies.

She also visited Farragut Elementary and El Marino and commented on how well the students were doing.

Mr. El Fattal reported that he visited Culver Park's Back-to-School Night. He commended the Principal, Terence Brown, along with Steven Gypes for their hard work in putting the event together.

Dr. Fiello reported that she, along with Mrs. Davis and Inez Bush, attended with that the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors meeting.

During the meeting a scroll was presented to the district as recognition for our role as one of the original five Vanguard Districts in the Arts for All Movement.

Dr. Fiello gave an update on the first Elementary district-wide staff meeting that will be held and discussed how the

meetings will be conducted. Dr. Fiello also met with the Principal of Maricosta High School, a few teachers, and the Interim Superintendent from Manhattan Beach Unified so that they could obtain information on the AVPA. Dr. Fiello also visited the OCD program and was very impressed with the program and commended Mrs. Audrey Stephens on the amount of administrative work that she is doing.

Dr. Fiello also gave clarification on a textbook issue and reported that there was no shortage of books.

Dr. Bubar asked for clarification on the Aides from West Los Angeles College. Mrs. Jaffe confirmed that they would just be in substitute positions.

6.3 Members of the Audience

Dr. Bob Knopf with the Culver City Lions Club provided an update on the vision screening provided by the Lions Club. He also provided information on their 8th Annual Cracked Crab Extravaganza. Dr. Knopf thanked the Board for letting the community express their opinion in regards to the Superintendent search. Dr. Beagles-Roos thanked the Lions Club for doing the vision screenings at the beginning of the year. Mr. Alan Elmont commented on an October 15th

newspaper article regarding the previous superintendent's salary and asked that the Board address the issues stated in the article and provide clarification.

Mr. Jerry Chabola asked that the meeting be adjourned in memory of Coach Ben Dudley. He also gave a brief bio on Mr. Dudley.

Mr. Chabola then gave an update on the High School sports teams and stated that four of the five competitive teams will be in the playoffs and that the school has been recognized as a Champions of Character School. Mr. David Mielke thanked Mrs. Jaffe for her visit to his class and agreed that clarity should be given on the prior Superintendent's salary. Mr. Mielke also felt that the Unions and teachers should have been more involved in the superintendent search. He also provided a bargaining update.

Mrs. Davis asked the Board members if they wanted staff to clarify or address any comments made by the public. Mr. Bubar asked Mr. El Fattal to provide clarification on the matter of the prior superintendent's salary. The Board agreed to allow Mr. El Fattal to provide this information to the public. Mr. El Fattal explained the prior superintendent's salary and addressed some of the misinformation that was printed in the article.

- Dr. Beagles-Roos had a question regarding the Reading Intervention Program. Dr. Fiello responded
- Mrs. Davis seconded Mr. Chabola's motion to adjourn the meeting in memory of Ben Dudley and commended the students that spoke at Mr. Dudley's funeral
- Monitoring the district's emergency preparedness
- Parents volunteering to teach at the schools
- Mrs. Davis requested if the Board could get a copy of the handbook from the Los Angeles County Office of Education's Discipline Workshop
